Production Bios

Lara Toner Haddock (Co-Producing Artistic Director) has directed over twenty productions for Austin Playhouse including *The Mysterious Affair at Styles, Red Hot Patriot, The Book of Will, Summer and Bird* (world premiere), *Monroe* (world premiere), *Miss Bennet: Christmas at Pemberley, Sense & Sensibility, Silent Sky, The Explorers Club, The Norwegians, Roaring, Venus in Fur, And Then There Were None, A Room With A View* (which she also adapted), *Age of Arousal, Dug Up, Women Who Steal, Moonlight and Magnolias,* and *A Texas Romance.* She also directed *Age of Arousal* at Southwestern University. She is a member of the Austin Playhouse Acting Company. Favorite Austin Playhouse roles include Tracy in *The Philadelphia Story* (Austin Chronicle Top 10 Performances of 2015), Catherine in *The Foreigner*, Brooke in *Other Desert Cities, The 39 Steps*, Hypatia in *Misalliance*, Lottie in *Enchanted April,* and Thomasina in *Arcadia.*

Suzan Zeder (Book & Lyrics) has been recognized nationally and internationally as one of the nation's leading playwrights for family audiences. Her plays have been performed in all fifty states, Canada, Great Britain, Germany, Japan, Korea, Israel, Australia, and New Zealand. She is a six-time winner of the Distinguished Play Award given by the American Alliance of Theatre and Education. Recent plays include *When She Had Wings*, commissioned by Imagination Stage and developed at New Visions New Voices at the Kennedy Center, and the book/ lyrics for a new musical, *Gretel!* with music and lyrics by Jenn Hartmann Luck. In 2013, Zeder retired from The University of Texas at Austin where she led the Playwriting/Directing program for over 23 years and was the first holder of an Endowed Chair in Theatre for Youth/Playwriting. As President of the Board of Trustees of The Children's Theatre Foundation of America, she helms an organization that provides grants to artists, bestows awards and funds collaborative activities in the field of Theatre for Young Audiences.

Jenn Hartmann Luck (Music & Lyrics) is a singer, songwriter, performer, arts educator, and an accomplished creator of new musical theatre. Notably, she is composer and co-lyricist of Gretel! The Musical, co-written with award-winning playwright Suzan Zeder. Gretel! premiered at Austin's Paramount Theatre in 2019, was produced by First Stage Milwaukee in 2020, and is available for licensing through Dramatic Publishing. Also with Zeder, Jenn received a Kennedy Center commission in 2020 for the short piece *The New Next-door Neighbor*. Jenn's other musical theatre workshops as composer/lyricist include You Can't Win and Footprints: An Eco-Musical. Jenn most recently served as Director of Partnerships and Programming for Education at the Paramount Theatre, on the Board of the International Association for Performing Arts for Youth, and as a Lecturer in the Department of Theatre & Dance at the University of Texas at Austin. She holds a BA in Theatre from Arizona State University and an MFA in Drama and Theatre for Youth and Communities from The University of Texas. Jenn's credits also include two original solo albums, I Admit and Silly Urban Girl, and her one-woman show *Not a Chorus Girl*, which played to audiences in both New York and Los Angeles. She was beyond proud to be invited by the White House to sing the National Anthem for President Obama in 2014 and is equally as proud to adapt children's stories into songs with the Paramount Story Wranglers.

Lena Gabrielle (Music Director/Arrangements) is a New York City and Austin-based music director, arranger/orchestrator, composer/lyricist, and performer specializing in new works development. Favorite NYC and regional credits include *Emojiland* (NYT Critics Pick January 2020), *Endangered!, The Most Miserable Christmas Tree*, and *A Taste of Things to Come*. Upcoming: *Falling in Love With Mr. Dellamort*. Lena's original songs and musicals have been performed all over the country, and her musical *Tink* received an award for excellence in family theatre at the New York Musical Festival in 2016. As an advocate for mental health awareness, Lena is a volunteer crisis counselor with Crisis Text Line, and she is also developing a one-woman show about living with and embracing mental illness. Robert S. Fisher (Sound Designer) is an artist, musician, and collaborator in Austin with Rude Mechs, Austin Playhouse, and Hyde Park Theatre. Robert has co-created, designed and/or performed in Rude productions since 2000, including most recently *Field Guide, Requiem for Tesla, Fixing Timon of Athens*, and *Now Now Oh Now*. He designed sound for the Austin Playhouse productions of *The Mysterious Affair at Styles, Tiny Beautiful Things, Holmes and Watson, The Book of Will, Summer and Bird, Monroe* and *Lucky Stiff*. For Hyde Park Theatre, Robert recently designed the regional premiers of *A Doll's House Pt. 2, The Antipodes, Wakey Wakey, The Wolves*, and last appeared in *The Night Alive*.

Buffy Manners (Costume Designer) designed over one hundred productions for Austin Playhouse and Don Toner. She has also designed *Three Sisters, Eurydice*, and *Measure For Measure* for Mary Moody Northen Theatre at St Edward's University; *Cherry Orchard* and *Ghosts* for Breaking String Theatre; and *A Midsummer Night's Dream, Hamlet, Henry V, Richard III, The Rivals*, and *Romeo and Juliet*, for Austin Shakespeare Festival. A few years ago, she was fortunate enough to be invited to design a production of *Hamlet* for Prague Shakespeare Festival at the National Theatre in Prague, Czech Republic, directed by Tina Packer. She has been nominated for several B. Iden Payne and Austin Critics' Table Awards for her past work, and last season won a Critic's Table award for *Shakespeare In Love* at Austin Playhouse.

Taji Senior (Dramaturg) is an actor, writer and theater maker. Her most recent solo project, *amendment: the making of an american myth, or the slowing sipping of a peacock tea*, is the recipient of three 2020 B. Iden Payne Awards for Outstanding Original Script, Outstanding Digital Production, and Outstanding Direction. Her solo performance, *'A' (What the Black Girl Found While Searching for God)* was produced as a radio play by The Parsnip Ship (NY) and her solo performance, *devour.*, was an official selection of LadyFest 2019 produced by The Tank NYC. She made her Austin Playhouse debut in the 2018 production of *Monroe*. She holds an MFA in Acting from UCLA (March 2021) and a BA in Journalism from Texas Tech University.

Laura Huffman Powell (Clara Prime) has had the joy of performing on many of Austin's stages over the past 30 years. Credits include *How To Succeed In Business Without Really Trying* (Mrs. Jones), *Company* (Joanne), *Disney's Beauty and the Beast* (Mrs. Potts), *The Thing About Men* (Lucy), and *Annie Get Your Gun* (Annie). Isabella "Bella" Ouellette (Clara 1/Child) lives in Chicago, IL and will be going into 6th grade. Bella has appeared as Ivanka in *Once* at the Paramount Theater in Aurora Illinois, Molly in The Performer's School production of *Annie Jr* at Ravinia Theater among other roles in various community theater productions. Other credits include a guest starring role in NBC's *Chicago Fire*, the lead role of Girl in the upcoming short film, *My Summer Vacation*, as well as several commercials and voice over roles. Isabella began singing at the young age of 2, beginning voice lessons at 5 and started her professional acting career at the age of 6.
